# PASS THE CLASSICS Act

GOSPEL MUSIC HAS FILLED LISTENERS WITH JOY AND LIFTED US UP.

But, due to a quirk in copyright law, the artists and copyright owners who created Gospel music before February 15, 1972 are entitled to nothing when their recordings are played on digital radio services. The CLASSICS Act (S. 2393) would fix this legal loophole to ensure that Gospel artists, and all artists who made iconic records before 1972, are finally compensated for their timeless work.

We urge the U.S. Senate to pass the **CLASSICS Act** and other pro-artist reforms quickly.
